The money will be used to for chlorine producing units (CPUs) and other equipment that is needed in Uganda, Kenya, and Malawi. John and Julie are planning to travel there in October to personally distribute the CPUs.

John said the garage sale was Julie's idea. They talked to friends about their upcoming trip and several of them generously donated items to the garage sale. John likes to repurpose/refinish furniture, so a vanity, a desk, and several other repurposing projects were sold.

While it was a "typical" kind of garage sale, they also handed out bottles of water with koozies that had the SWIM logo on them. The koozies were obtained through a grant from Thrivent. A donation box was available for those who chose to donate directly to SWIM. And people did – \$180 was collected in the box!

Brochures about SWIM, along with the SWIM banner, were also at the garage sale to share information to those who wanted to learn more.
